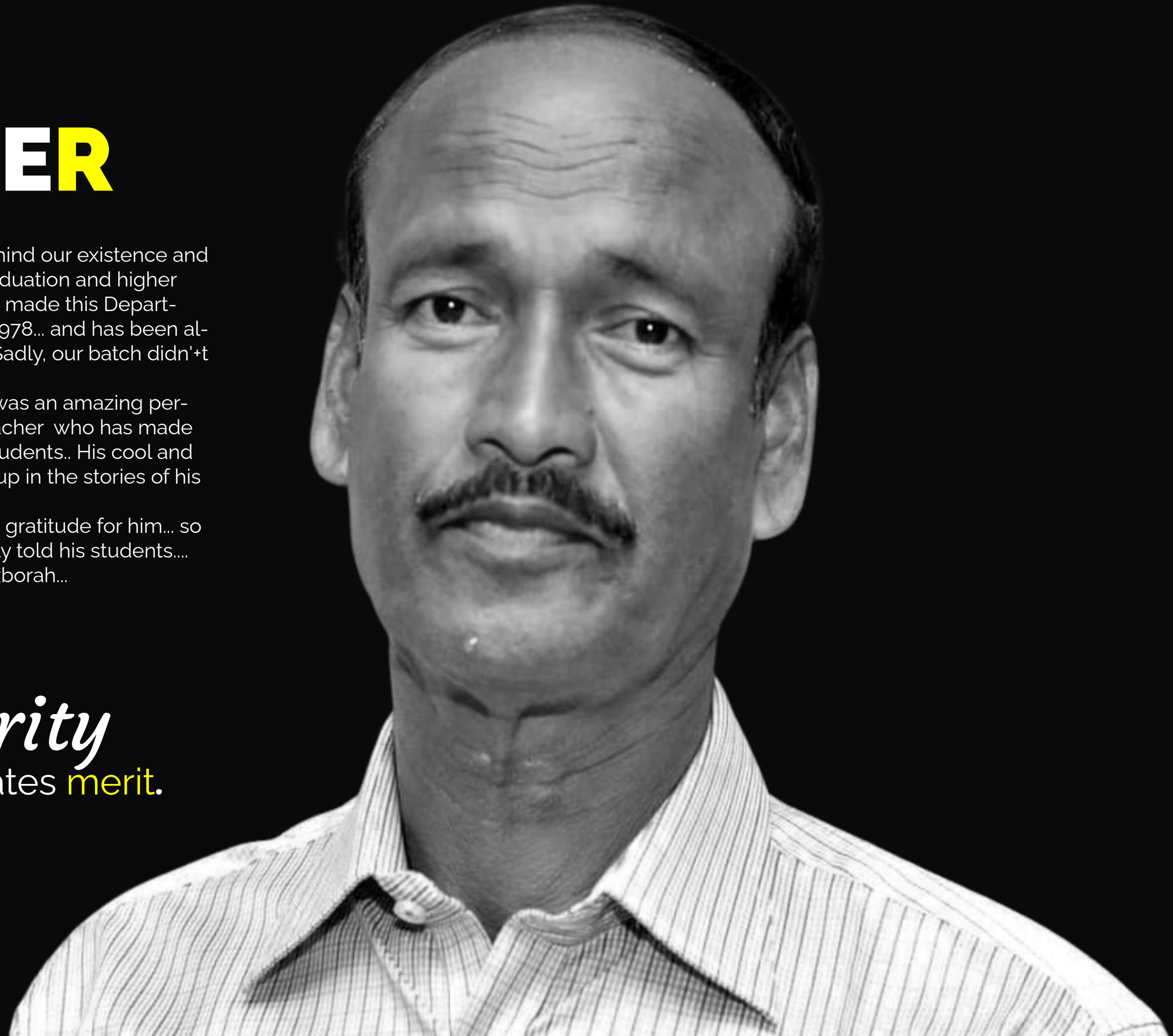
# FOUNDER

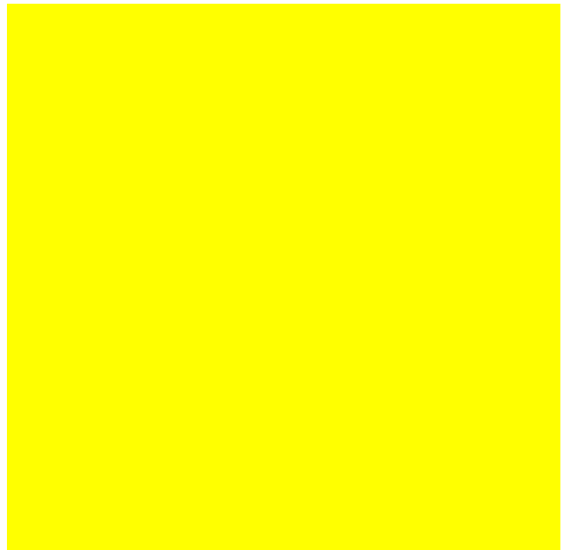

*Now, having realized this, you can manage your time better. Once you start managing your time with a 'To Do List', you will begin to enjoy your life.*

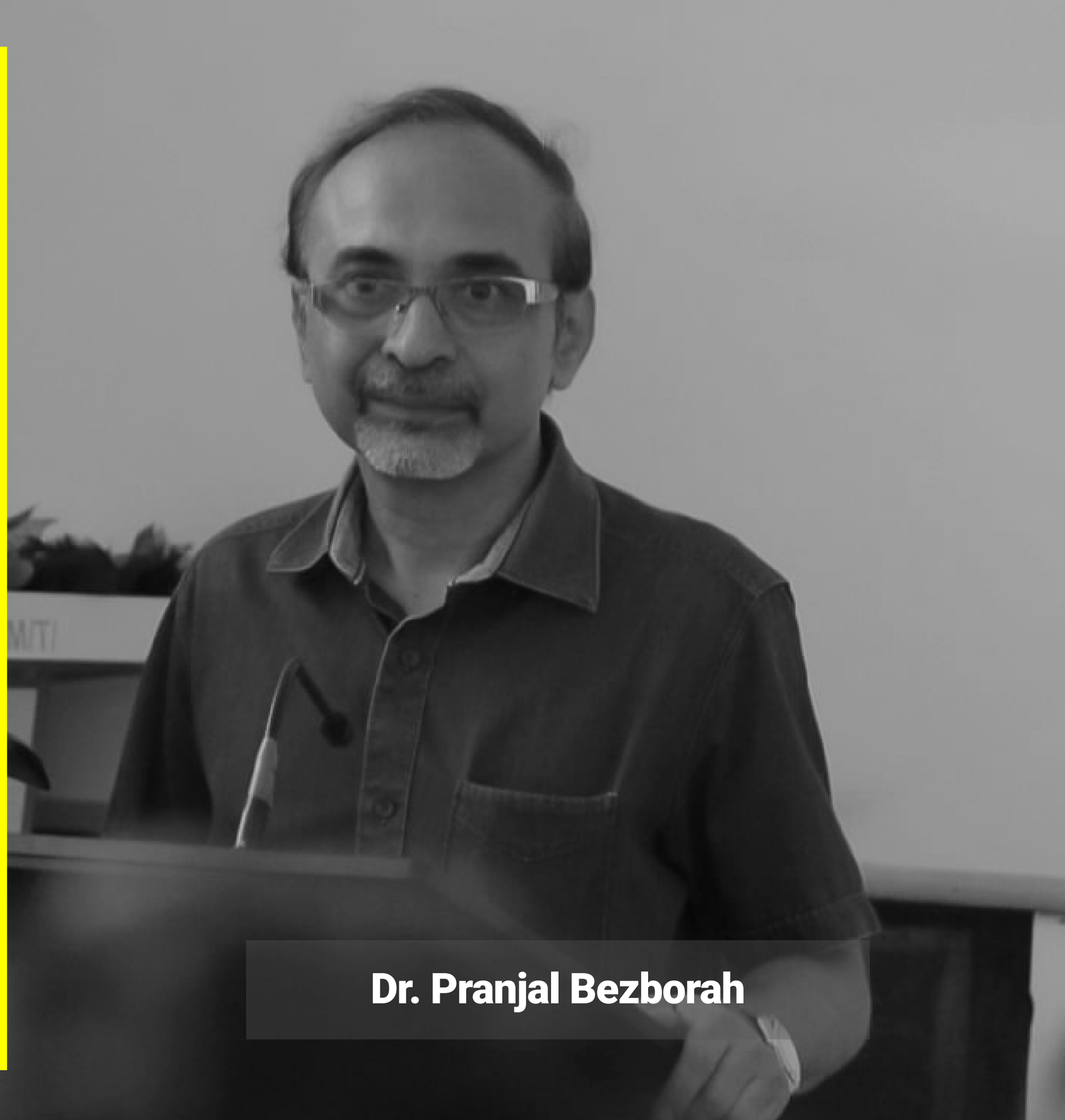

# INDIA WITHOUT ASSAM



**A**ssam, the Shangri-La of North-East India and the 15th most populated state in the country. From breathtaking landscapes to rich culture and traditions, from mouth-watering cuisine to stunning architecture, Assam has it all. But, what if something such astonishing didn't exist in the country? How different would India be without Assam? Let's dive into this hypothetical scenario.

What if there was no Assam in India? The most straightforward deduction would be that the country of a land area of 3.287 million sq. km. would be about 79,000 sq. km. smaller without Assam. The population of the country would miss out on almost 3.55 crore people.

But there would be more to miss out on than just the size of land or number of people. The country would never know of four other states - Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Meghalaya, Mizoram, if Assam didn't exist, as they were all carved out of 'undivided' Assam and would not come into being in the first place.

Assam assumes the responsibility of bringing together many lands by connecting the north-eastern states with the mainland of India via a small strip of land called the Sili-guri Corridor. Perhaps the north-eastern states would never be part of India if Assam didn't exist. If we delve into the geographical aspect a bit more, the Brahmaputra River would never split to give birth to the world's largest river island- Majuli, and the world would be devoid of such mammoth and beautiful spectacle. Correspondingly, the world might never be able to counterbalance the loss of the world's smallest river island- Umananda, which has been attracting tourists from the nook and corner of the world because of its historical significance.

Historically, Assam was the first Indian state to adopt an anthem of its own, as early as when it was a province of British India. So the progressions of having a state anthem would never arise (or Odisha might have taken this credit!). While discussing the history of Assam, we must not forget about the prominent role played by the Ahom Dynasty. This dynasty was the longest ruling dynasties of ancient India and is known for its inventions like the Paik system and the system of giving powers to ministers to remove unacceptable kings. During the Ahom dynasty, Asia's first amphitheater, "Rang Ghar" was constructed. The country wouldn't hold the pride of having such a great dynasty as a part of ancient India if Assam didn't exist.

Let's move onto something lighter now! Most of us start our day with a cup of tea. Today, India may have to do away with its standing as the second-largest tea producing country in the world if Assam never came into being. Not only the country, but the entire world would never be able to counterpoise over the loss of 1/6th of its tea production. The production of tea, petroleum resources, Muga Silk, and the tourism industry of Assam makes up for a relevant contribution to the economy of the state and the country in general. That's the reason why the absence of Assam would cost India to miss out on the 19th highest tax-paying state (1st among the Northeast states), and

that's huge!

The state enjoys the privilege of being the most biologically diverse area in the whole of South Asia. It is evident from the fact that the Northeast region, which accounts for just 7.98% of the geographical area of the country, covers nearly 25% of the country's forest. India would forever repent over such a great loss!

Among other things, 22.68% of the Indian flora, 9 out of 15 Indian primate species, and home to 53.5% of the bird species found in the Indian sub-continent would not exist in the geographical boundary of the country. Despite all this, the India State of Forest Report 2019 reported a decline in

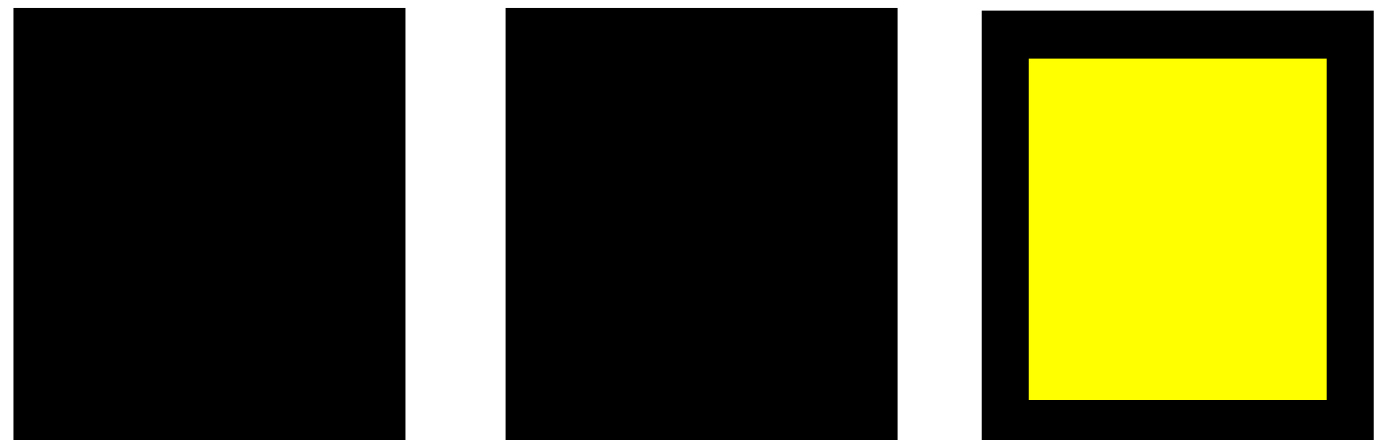
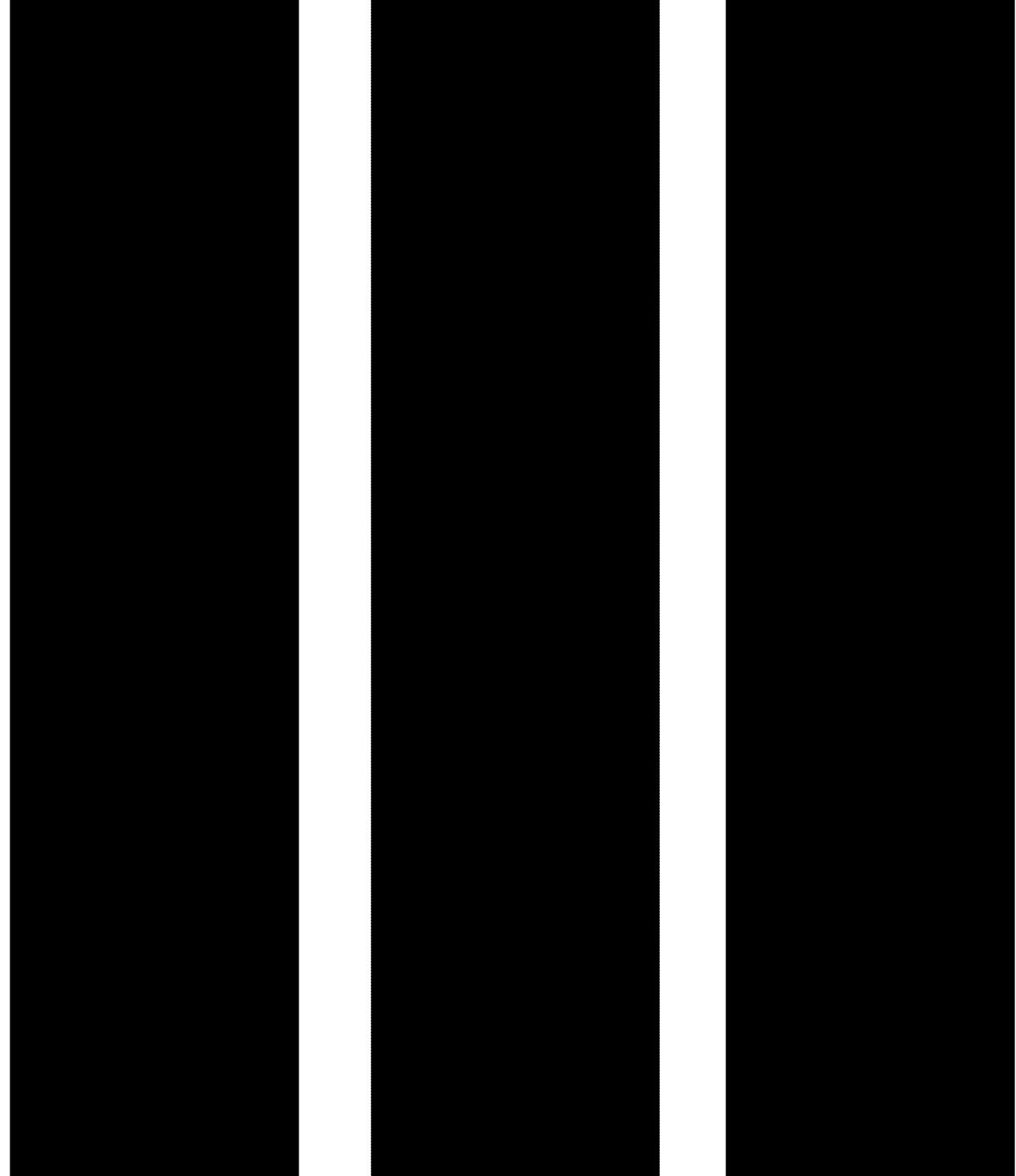
the forest area in the Northeast land of the country. This reduction has been an ongoing trend as the region suffers a loss of about 3,199 sq. km. of forest area from the year 2009. This is one of the reasons why the state sees major floods every year.



The new EIA draft notification will make deforestation legal and much easier, especially in the Northeast area. And if more forests are cleared, the floods will be even more catastrophic. Instead of taking effective actions, the government has taken obstructive ones. It wants to clear more forests. Eventually, the floods will be more frequent.

In my opinion, the Northeast region is the most ignored and unheard part of India. It may be unbelievable, but racism exists in India, and people from the North Assam and the entire Northeast is an intrinsic part of India. Its contribution is something we should be proud of. Its unique and interesting culture is something we should preserve. If there was no Assam, India as we know today would be a lot different. We are very happy that Assam exists, and even more than that, we are proud that we are a part of this amazing state!

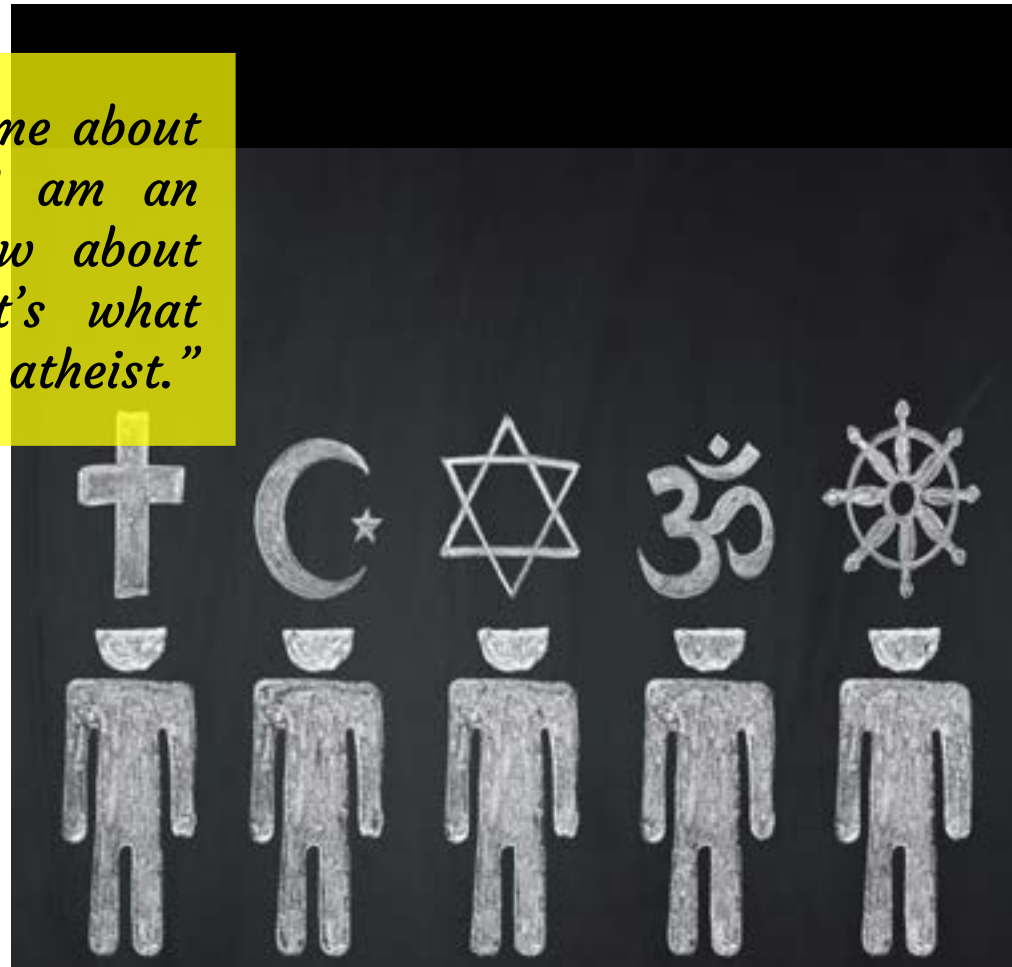

# HOW INNOVATIVE IDEAS *Arise?*

**IN** 2010, Thomas Thwaites decided he wanted to build a toaster from scratch. He walked into a shop, purchased the cheapest toaster he could find, and promptly went home and broke it down piece by piece. Thwaites had assumed the toaster would be a relatively simple machine. By the time he was finished deconstructing it, however, there were more than 400 components laid out on his floor. The toaster contained over 100 different materials, three of the primary ones being plastic, nickel, and steel. He decided to create the steel components first. After discovering that iron ore was required to make steel, Thwaites called up an iron mine in his region and asked if they would let him use some for the project. Surprisingly, they agreed.

The Toaster Project - The victory was short-lived. When it was time to create the plastic case for his toaster, Thwaites realized he would need crude oil to make the plastic. This time, he called up BP and asked if they would fly him out to an oil rig and lend him some oil for the project. They immediately refused. It seems oil companies are not nearly as generous as iron mines. Thwaites had to settle for collecting plastic

scraps and melting them into the shape of his toaster case. This is not as easy as it sounds. The homemade toaster ended up looking more like a melted cake than a kitchen appliance.

This pattern continued for the entire span of The Toaster Project. It was nearly impossible to move forward without the help of some previous process. To create the nickel components, for example, he had to resort to melting old coins. Later, he would say, "I have realized that if you started absolutely from scratch, you could easily spend your life making a toaster."

Do not Start From Scratch. Starting from scratch is usually a bad idea. Too often, we assume innovative ideas and meaningful changes require a blank slate. When business projects fail, we say things like, "Let's go back to the drawing board."

When we consider the habits we would like to change, we think, "I just need a fresh start." However, creative progress is rarely the result of throwing out all previous ideas and innovations and completely re-imagining the world.

Consider an example from

nature:

Some experts believe the feathers of birds evolved from reptilian scales. Through the forces of evolution, scales gradually became small feathers, which were used for warmth and insulation at first. Eventually, these small fluffs developed into larger feathers capable of flight. There was not a magical moment when the animal kingdom said, "Let's start from scratch and create an animal that can fly." The development of flying birds was a gradual process of iterating and expanding upon ideas that already worked.

The process of human flight followed a similar path. We typically credit Orville and Wilbur Wright as the inventors of modern flight. However, we seldom discuss the aviation pioneers who preceded them like Otto Lilienthal, Samuel Langley, and Octave Chanute. The Wright brothers learned from and built upon the work of these people during their quest to create the world's first flying machine.

The most creative innovations are often new combinations of old ideas. Innovative thinkers don't create, they connect. Furthermore, the most effective way to make progress is usually by making a 1 percent improvement to what already works

rather than breaking down the whole system and starting over.

The Toaster Project is an example of how often we fail to notice the complexity of our modern world. When you buy a toaster, you do not think about everything that has to happen before it appears in the store. You are not aware of the iron being carved out of the mountain or the oil being drawn up from the earth. We are mostly blind to the remarkable interconnect- edness of things. This is important to understand because, in a complex world, it is hard to see which forces are working for you as well as which forces are working against you. Similar to buying a toaster, we tend to focus on the final product and fail to recognize the many processes leading up to it.

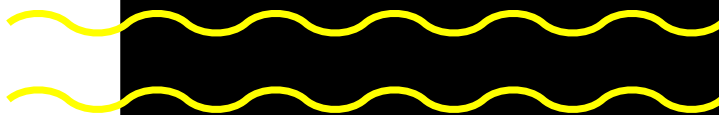
When you are dealing with a complex problem, it is usually better to build upon what already works. Any idea that is currently working has passed a lot of tests. Old ideas are a secret weapon because they have already managed to survive in a complex world.

However, it is undoubtedly one of the sectors that bring a lot of fulfillment to young people who dare to take the plunge and work in that position themselves in the digital job market. If someone has been able to do it and is happy about it, everyone can do it. It just needs to have the courage to dare. Freelancing

is nowadays an effective solution to the problem of unemployment faced by young people.

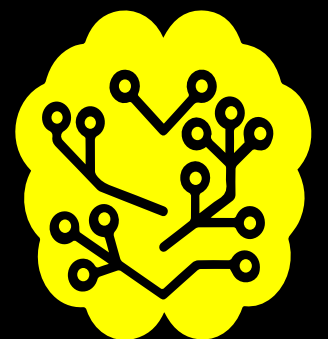
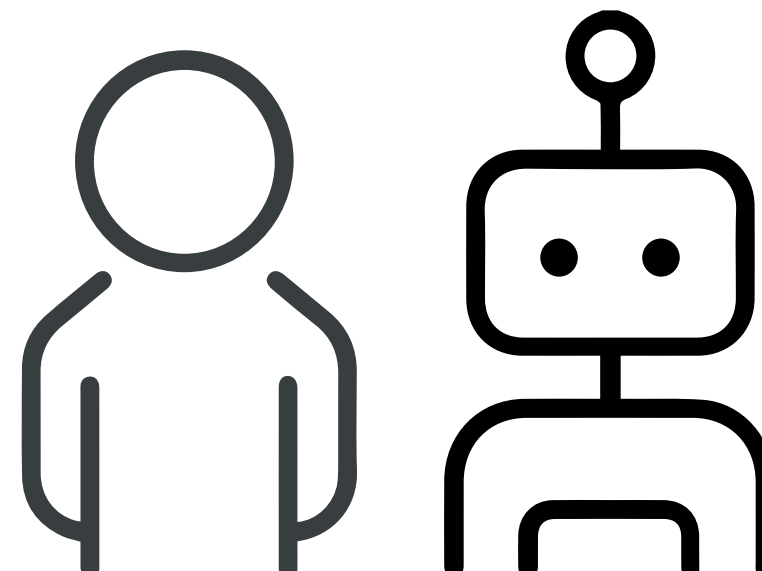
Artificial intelligence technology is developing very fast and it already surpasses human decision making in certain instances. The Google and Microsoft are

যায় কিন্তু মাংস থকা দিনকেইটাত বেল বজাৰ আগৰে পৰাই দীঘলীয়া লাইন বনিয়ে থাকিছিল, ৰাতি ৰাতি মেকুৰীৰ খোজৰ দৰে লগৰবোৰৰ বাৰ্থদে চেলিব্ৰেচন কৰা-কিজানি মেট্ৰ’ন মেমে আহি ধমুকি দিয়ে, গা ধুবলৈ বাথৰুমৰ বাহিৰত দীঘলীয়া লাইন লাগে বাকেটৰ-যাৰ বাকেট যিমান নম্বৰত আছে তাইয়ে সেই নম্বৰত গা ধুব-এইবোৰৰ দৰে বহু স্মৃতিৰে এই হৃদয়খন ভৰি আছে।
