BACKGROUND OF THE PROGRAMME

"Official statistics" means statistics derived by the Government agencies from statistical surveys, administrative and registration records and other forms and papers, the statistical analyses of which are published regularly, or planned to be published regularly, or could reasonably be published regularly. The primary aim of official statistics is to provide an accurate, up-to-date, comprehensive and meaningful empirical picture of the society and economy to support the formulation and monitoring of economic and social policies by the Government. As official statistics is produced within the Government, its credibility and integrity depends on professional independence of statistical Departments/ Offices/ Units/ Cells. Professional independence is an essential prerequisite and the means to provide objective statistical information free from any influences. The statistical system is laterally decentralised among the Ministries of the Government of India (GOI), and in every one of them, vertically decentralised, between the Centre and the States. At the national level, the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MOSPI) is the nodal Ministry on statistical matters. At State level, the concerned Directorates of Economics & Statistics (DESs) are the nodal offices on statistical matters. The National Statistical Commission (NSC) is the apex advisory body on statistical matters. The existing institutional arrangements and legal framework have been found to be inadequate in the light of the emerging challenges. Official statistics refer to public information which is produced for the development of the society and the country as a whole. Official statistics should be equally accessible to everyone and enable the public and government to make the necessary decisions. Indian has a strong official statistical system which functions within the overall administrative frame work of the country. The main functions of the statistical system would typically include collection, validation, compilation and publication of official statistics. Creating awareness about official statistical system prevailing in the country among the students will help them in understanding the whole administrative framework. The proposed programmes broadly focus on Indian Statistical System & its Challenges, Economic Census in India, Industrial Statistics and its use, Conducting Agriculture Census: Indian experience, System of Agriculture Statistics in India and its challenges, Population Census 2011, Challenges and its historical perspective, National Statistical Office, Collection of Health & Demographic Statistics and its challenges; Economic Policies of Government and some key Indicators for monitoring. They will also be able to learn how official statistical systems are in use in the growth of the society and the country as a whole. By observing the practical use of the subjects, viz., Statistics, Economics and Mathematics in creating and managing the official system in India will help them to develop their interest towards their subject. In Assam, very few students opt his career in official and administrative statistics though there are huge career opportunities in these fields. Again, in our PG programme there are provision to take Official and financial Statistics as Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses. But, it is observed that the students are reluctant to takethese courses. However, the UGC guideline have no clear direction in this context. As a result, the students interest in ISS is less from North East India as a whole and Assam in particular. Keeping all these points, the programme is proposed to motivate our students.

OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAMME

The main objective of the programme is to create awareness about the whole statistical administrative system of India and to motivate our students to opt Official and Financial Statistics as career.

■ The specific objectives of the programme are

- To make the participants understand the importance of Official Statistics.
- To make the participants aware about the statistical administrative system in India.
- To make the participants aware about the different sources of official statistics in India.
- To make the participants aware about the mode of operations of different organizations related to the collection of official statistics in India.
- To motivate the participants for empirical research using Official and Financial Statistics.
- To motivate the participants so that they can compete for jobs in Statistical Administration System in India.

DIBRUGARH UNIVERSITY AND THE DEPARTMENT AT A GLANCE
