PREFACE

A Brief Account of the University

Dibrugarh University, the eastern most centre for higher learning is gaining prominence as a major intellectual hub in Assam in particular and the country in general. The University was established in the year 1965 under the provisions of the Dibrugarh University Act, 1965 (Assam Act VIII of 1965). This residential cum affiliating institution of higher learning was conceived and planned for augmenting skilled human resources for developing and exploiting the rich biodiversity and mineral wealth of the region. The rich floraand fauna coupled with diverse mineral base of the region offers a unique opportunity for the University for exploration, study and research in various frontier areas of knowledge. The University is located in a lush green ambiance in Dibrugarh town amidst the industrial belt of Assam surrounded by Oil and Tea industries. It has territorial reach over nine districts of upper Assam viz., Dibrugarh, Dhemaji, Golaghat, Jorhat, Majuli, Lakhimpur, Sivasagar, Charaideo and Tinsukia.

The First Statutes, the Ordinances and the Regulations of the University came into force with effect from 13th October 1965 and the various University Authorities started functioning from 1st April, 1966. The University has completed its Golden Jubilee year in 2015. The University had a humble beginning during its initial phase with a nominal assistance received from the state Government a statutory recurring grant for non-plan expenditure amounting to Rs. 20.00 Lakhs in 1965 along with some fund for plan expenditure. However, the quantum of financial assistance has increased by manifolds from the government agencies in the last 55 years for the University. His Excellency Professor Jagdish Mukhi, the Governor of Assam is the Hon'ble Chancellor of the University and Prof. Ranjit Tamuli is the current Vice Chancellor of the University, since July 18, 2018.

The University endeavours to present an account through this report about the multiple spheres of activities during the period from 1st January 2020 to 31st December, 2020.

The University is now imparting higher education in various branches of learning in the faculties of Arts, Commerce, Science and Technology, Law, Engineering, Pharmaceutical Science, Teachers' Training, Management and Computer Science. Starting its journey in July 1965 with seven Post-Graduate Departments in Arts and Science and imparting education to less than 100 students the Dibrugarh University presently has seventeen teaching departments and Nineteen centres of Studies offering different academic programmes covering Post Graduate, Under Graduate, Advanced Post Graduate Diploma, Post Graduate Diploma, Diploma and Certificate level programmes to about 4500 in campus students besides the students studying in its affiliated colleges.

Based on long fifty-five years of history and tradition, Dibrugarh University strives to respond to the needs of the society. The University is determined to provide effective knowledge to its students and to administer research and education with the aim to become a University that is open to society and eager to welcome new challenges.

The University is a member of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) and the Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU).

Lakshminath Bezbaroa Granthagar (L.N.B. Library)

The Central Library of Dibrugarh University, popularly known as Lakshminath Bezbaroa Library was established in the year 1967 and since then it has remained as an integral part of all accomplishments of academic excellence and endeavor of the University. The Library was shifted to its present building, with an area of 33570 sq. ft., in 1984. With the passage of time, the university has extended its wings in manifolds, and so, obviously, there is a growing rush in the Central Library also, in terms of books, journals, services, e-resources, and other related conventional and unconventional activities. To keep pace with such growing demands, the library is rendering yeoman service to the university community as a whole. The Library collection consists of a balanced stock of books, journals (online, current print and back volumes, rare books, thesis & dissertations, newspapers, cartographs, etc. All these collections are placed for display and use by the users in various sections like Section for Social Sciences, Section for Humanities and Literature, Section for Science Collection, North East Collection, Gandhi and Nobel Laureate Collection, Thesis and Dissertation and print Journals and Newspaper Section.

The LNB Library is one of the pioneers of library automation in the North East India and started automation programme in the year of 1997 with the application of CDS/ISIS. The database was migrated to SOUL 1.0 software provided by the INFLIBNET Centre, Gandhinagar, in 2004. Since 2007, the library is providing Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) to the user community. In the year 2010, the SOUL software was upgraded to the SOUL 2.0 with newer features like Web-OPAC and started facilitating Web-OPAC from 2012.

Extensive awareness programmes are conducted for use of subscribed resources from EBSCO, Cambridge University Press, Elsevier and Tailor and Francis; consortium based resources from eShodhSindhu and DeLCon; and open source resources of scholarly contents provided especially by NMEICT, Sakshat, NPTEL, CEC, NDL, e-PG Pathshala, e-Acharya, DOAJ, OAL, OAPEN, OAJSE including Shodhganga; access to Global Open ETDs along with the Indian Open ETDs through Library portal have surely expanded the horizon of e-resources accessibility by the researchers. Subscription of e-books of more than 2,00,000 titles is another significant events in respect to new mode of collection development along with its traditional mode of collection development process. For remote access and federated search of subscribed information two software, such as OpenAthens and EBSCO Discovery Services (EDS) have been used from 2021. Installation of specialized software and hardware for users with Visual Impairment is another significant development to encompass physically challenged users in the ambient of virtual Library.

With Automated Library Management Systems, the LNB Library is not lacking behind of any other university libraries of the country as far as application of ICT is concerned. The Library has sitting capacity of more than 260 users at a time in various clusters arranged with modern ergonomic reading facilities with installation of 24 standalone Kiosk for Web-OPAC and 12 CCTV surveillance.

A High Performance Computer (HPC) is launched in the Centre for Atmospheric Studies

Dibrugarh University joined the league of India's powerful supercomputers on 10th February 2021 with the launch of a new High Performance Computer (HPC). The High Performance Computer (HPC) system is housed at the Centre for Atmospheric Studies procured from the grant received under the Human and Institutional Capacity Building (HICAB) Network Programmes as part of the National Mission on Sustaining Himalayan Ecosystem (NMSHE) Strategic Programmes, Large Initiatives and Coordinated Action Enabler (SPLICE), CLIMATE CHANGE PROGRAMME (CCP) Department of Science & Technology (DST), Government of India. The project was proposed to study the impact of aerosols/gases on regional climate and weather extremes over Sub Himalayan North East Region using Regional Climate Model by Dr Binita Pathak (Project Investigator) and Prof P K Bhuyan (Co-Project Investigator). The HPC is comprised of one master node with 24 cores and 6 computational nodes each with 32 cores and a memory of 60TB. It will provide an opportunity to improve climate science research using climate model ongoing in the University. In addition to climate science, HPC is widely used for weather forecasting and in the areas of Hydrology, engineering, space research, physics, chemistry, biology, medicine, artificial intelligence, big data management etc. The system was inaugurated by Dean, Research and Development, Prof Dipak Chetia and Registrar i/c Prof Jiten Hazarika in the programme hosted by the Chairperson, Centre for Atmospheric Studies Prof. Kalyan Bhuyan. Both PI and Co-PI and the faculty members of the Department of Physics and research scholars of the Centre for Atmospheric Studies were present in the occasion.

A Talk on Innovations and Productivity by Padma Shri Dr. Uddhab Kumar Bharali Organized by Department of Commerce, Dibrugarh University in association with Assam Productivity Council, Tinsukia



International Workshop on ICTP Regional Climate Model: Applications Over South Asia CORDEX Domain

The Department of Physics, Dibrugarh University organised an international workshop keeping in mind the challenges faced by researchers and scientists in accessing the Regional Climate Model developed by the ICTP, Italy. Dr Binita Pathak, Asst. Professor, Dept of Physics, being a junior associate of the ICTP, Italy convened the workshop which commenced on 22nd February and ended on 28th February. More than hundred people participated in the inaugural session and attended the keynote address by Indian meteorologist Professor Bhupendra Nath Goswami, FNA, FASc, FNASc, FTWAS, SERB Distinguished Scientist of SERB (DST) in Cotton University, Assam, a former director of the Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology and professor in the Indian Institute of Science, Bangluru. The inaugural ceremony was followed by the 'Theme Talk' by the developer of the climate model-RegCM, *Dr. Filippo Giorgi*, Group Head, Earth System Physics, The Abdus Salam International Centre for Theoretical Physics, Italy, and an 'Invited Talk' by *Prof. Allison L Steiner*, Department of Climate and Space Sciences and Engineering, University of Michigan, USA.

Climate models are a part of the Earth System models used to represent the complex climate system, i.e., the interaction between the geosphere, biosphere, atmosphere, hydrosphere, cryosphere etc. using mathematical equations based on physics, chemistry and biology. Using these models we can understand the changes of the climate from paleoclimatic age to the future, about 100 years later. Going by its importance in the research fields, it has become a necessary prerequisite for the climate scientists to be well equipped with its operating processes. For last ten years, the developers of the world's oldest model-RegCM, The Abdus Salam International Centre for Theoretical Physics organise workshop for the World Research Community, where only a handful are privileged to participate. So keeping in view of the benefit of the larger scientific community in India and adjoining countries (together known as South Asia) working in the area of climate change, Dr Pathak organised this International Workshop under her aegis.

Due to COVID-19, the workshop was organised online and was attended by 60-90 participants including faculties, scientists, post-doctoral fellows and PhD fellows from India and neighbouring Nations. Extensive sessions including both theory and hands-on training were delivered by the following speakers-

- Dr. Ahmed Shalaby, Scientist (*University of New Brunswick (UNB), New Brunswick, Canada*)

Dr. Narendra Ojha, a Scientist, from the Space and Atmospheric Sciences Division of Physical Research Laboratory, Ahmedabad, India, presented his modelling activities over the South Asia and discussed about the challenges and opportunities as well.

Dr Vijaya Kumar S Nair, Scientist, Space Physics Laboratory, Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala, India had a talk on application of the RegCM model over the glacier melting in Himalayas on the last day of the workshop. His talk was followed by the Valedictory session, presided over by the Dean R & D, Dibrugarh University. Prof Pradip Kumar Bhuyan, who initiated the Space and Atmospheric Physics research in Dibrugarh University also addressed the participants during the session. The speakers and convener were overwhelmed by the response of the research community to learn about the Regional Climate Model, which has its importance in understanding the climate and mitigating changes in terms of the ever-increasing temperature and atmospheric composition etc. Many of the participants are requesting for extended sessions of the workshop mainly on hands-on training.

She obtained her Ph.D in Physics in 2016 for her work on Atmospheric trace gases using both measurements and modelling under the supervision of Prof. Pradip Kumar Bhuyan, Department of Physics, Dibrugarh University. Her research career in Atmospheric Science started during






Category-wise and Gender-wise distribution of students in the Teaching Departments and Centres for Studies enrolled during the session 2021-2022

















Sex-wise distribution of Students enrolled in 2021-2022








Category-wise distribution of Students enrolled in the Session 2021-2022


